SHORT SYNOPSIS

DEEP RISING is a tale of geopolitical, scientific and corporate intrigue: investigating the future of the world's energy crisis and how it is currently tied to the fate of the deep ocean floor, which is intricately tied to our survival.

5 years after Anote's Ark, Matthieu Rytz returns with this up-to-the-minute tale of geopolitical, scientific, and corporate intrigue that exposes the machinations of a secretive organization empowered to greenlight massive extraction of metals from the deep seafloor that are deemed essential to the electric battery revolution. Narrated by Jason Momoa, Deep Rising illuminates the vital relationship between the deep ocean and sustaining life on Earth. The documentary also follows mining startup The Metals Company, as it pursues funding, public favor, and permission from the International Seabed Authority to mine wide swaths of the Pacific Ocean floor. Rytz's fly-on-the-wall access observes extraction companies as they co-opt scientific studies and deliver pitches to investors, proposing how the costs of industrializing our Earth's last pristine environment can be justified to access metals they claim will benefit all of mankind. As oil conglomerates pivot investments to deep-ocean mining, Deep Rising examines humanity's destructive pattern of extracting materials for profit and asks why we don't choose, instead, to develop abundant resources to solve our energy problems.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

"Before I share with you why making Deep Rising is so important, let me introduce myself. Over the past decade, I have been telling stories about our changing climate. My previous project, Anote's Ark, is an award-winning feature film and VR experience that surveys the fate of the Republic of Kiribati as rising seas threaten the island nation's existence. While making that documentary, I quickly realized that in order to address our climate crisis, we must imperatively

protect our planet's biodiversity — especially our oceans.

A month after Anote's Ark premiered at the Sundance Film Festival in 2018, I started developing a new film about the complex issues related to deep-sea mining. I intuitively knew that I was committing to and embarking on a long-lasting project, but I didn't fully realize that I was opening a Pandora's box that would reveal one of the most important — and untold — environmental stories of our time.

Over the next few years, the fate of the deep ocean will be decided by a handful of people pulling the strings behind closed doors. Hundreds of billions of dollars are currently being spent on the development of large-scale, battery-based energy infrastructures that require massive amounts of metal extraction, which in turn engender colossal environmental costs. And as the world celebrates our slow transition away from fossil fuels, some major oil and gas conglomerates are currently diversifying their investments in order to refurbish their offshore infrastructures. They're gearing up to strip mine the deep ocean and secure an access to the world's largest deposits of

the much-needed metals used in battery chemistry.

The lithium-ion revolution might well be based on a destructive and inadequate technology, spearheaded by an industry aggressively lobbying for dirty energy that can be controlled, instead of democratizing access to sustainable resources such as graphene or hydrogen.

I strongly believe that without a real paradigm shift on the horizon, we will keep extracting raw materials from our fragile biosphere, making a planetary cataclysm all but inevitable. My film will push the narrative much further, bringing to light the fundamental failure of our extraction system by focusing on a very simple and verifiable truth: that we have created an infinite growth model on a finite planet.

Let's be clear here: We are at a fundamental crossroads and cannot allow more extraction to produce energy if we wish to secure our future as Homo sapiens as part of our remarkable biosphere. Ultimately, Deep Rising will plant seeds of hope and inspire by making clear that a green revolution is still within reach if we're willing to radically put an end to our destructive behaviors and create a truly regenerative economic and social architecture."

A visual anthropologist by training, his passion for storytelling has led him across the globe to witness and document complex human and environmental stories. Matthieu specializes in creating multidisciplinary, multichannel projects using film, still images and virtual reality; using whatever medium best serves the story.

Jason Momoa is a global movie star, entrepreneur, and activist, who continues to captivate audiences through his incredible work on and off-screen. Momoa and his production company, On the Roam, bring a unique and beautiful perspective to storytelling through their cinematic and human approach.

In addition to his film and television career, in the Summer of 2022, the United Nations Environmental Programme (UNEP) appointed Momoa as its official ambassador for Life Below Water. With a deep passion for environmental sustainability, Momoa founded Mananulu, an aluminum-bottled water company, on a mission to end single-use plastic water bottles.

President of the EarthSense Foundation and an ocean and environmental philanthropist, Shannon serves on the boards of Sylvia Earle's Mission Blue, WildAid, Oceans5 and Compassion for Addiction. Shannon served as an executive producer on many noteworthy documentaries, including Chasing Coral, Mission Blue, Anote's Ark and Sharkwater Extinction.

SHARI SANT PLUMMER - Executive Producer

Shari Sant Plummer Executive Producer Code Blue Charitable Foundation. She also serves as secretary/trustee of the Summit Charitable Foundation, board member on the Sylvia Earle Alliance and vice president of Seacology. Shari was an executive producer on Chasing Coral, Mission Blue, Anote's Ark and Sharkwater Extinction.

DONA BERTARELLI - Executive Producer

Dona Bertarelli is a sportswoman, investor and philanthropist who has dedicated nearly two decades to protecting ecosystems by creating large-scale marine protected areas. With her children and husband, Dona founded 'Sails of Change', a foundation dedicated to the protection and regeneration of biodiversity. Sails of Change's activities focus on the goal of fully or highly protecting at least 30% of global ocean and land by 2030. Sails of Change raises environmental awareness and promotes positive change at many levels, including connecting with a wide public through art, sports and education.

ANNIE RONEY - Executive Producer

After nine years working for a top industry distributor, Annie founded ro*co films in 2000 with two complementary ideas. The first is the belief that a well-told, well-researched and emotionally-driven documentary can challenge the way people think about issues in every corner of the globe. The second is that, to be entrusted with the distribution of these stories, ro*co needs to be in service to

the filmmaker first and foremost. ro*co has distributed award-winning docs including 18 Oscar-nominated feature documentaries, such as Born Into Brothels, The Invisible War, Cartel Land, Life Animated, Knife Skills, Human Flow, An Inconvenient Sequel, RBG and Virunga.

Mr. Fischer is a member of Ocean5 and the Co-founder and President of Planet Heritage Foundation. Her books about the ocean include the *New York Times* 2021 top summer read *The Brilliant Abyss* and the Guardian bestseller *Spirals in Time*. She teaches at Cambridge University, is a storytelling ambassador at the Save Our Seas Foundation and science advisor for the ocean conservation charity Sea Changers. Helen divides her time between Cambridge, UK and the wild, west coast of France.
