

WHAT IS 'SONG LANG'?



Song lang is a percussion instument used to control tempo, phrazing and signal the beginning and the end of musical passages. It is the rhythmic foundation for both instrumentalists and performers. It is considered the soul of Cai-luong, Vietnamese modern folk opera.

Separated, its two components take on a different meaning - two (Song), men (Lang).



WHAT IS 'CAI-LUONG'?

Cai-luong (roughly translated as "renovated theater") is a form of modern folk opera, particularly famous in Southern Vietnam, it is the convergence of southern Vietnamese folk songs, classical music and modern spoken drama. It took origin in Southern Vietnam in the early 20th century and blossomed in the 1930s as a theatre of the middle class under the French colony.

2018 marks 100 year anniversary of Cai-luong. Although its golden age has passed, Cai-luong continues moving forward in the modern era, working hard to attract a new audience. In spite of the challenges, Cai-luong has kept the flame alive, bringing its distinctive bluesy sound to yet another generation of fans.

ABOUT THE FILM

SYNOPSIS

Set in 1980s Saigon, Song Lang is a gritty underworld noir hiding a tender, romantic heart. At the film's core is the unlikely bond that develops between hunky, brooding Dung (Lien Binh Phat), a tough debt collector for a ruthless loan shark, and Linh Phung (V-pop star Isaac), a charismatic young opera singer for a struggling company that performs cai luong, a modern form of traditional Vietnamese folk opera.

The two meet when Dung comes to forcefully collect a debt from the opera troupe, but when their paths cross again, a friendship—and then more—develops, awakening surprising, tender feelings in both men. Their story, too, soon scales operatic heights. With his first feature film, director Leon Le has delivered a rich drama: a smoldering relationship between two apparent opposites—equally uncompromising—set against the backdrop of a gorgeous, fading art form.

LEON LE (Writer/Director/Editor) was born and raised in Saigon, Vietnam and moved to the US at the age of 13. An accomplished Actor/Dancer/Singer with credits including Broadway, film and TV, he always has a passion for filmmaking.

As a self-taught filmmaker, his multiple award winning short films Dawn and Talking to My Mother which he wrote/directed/edited won critical acclaim and screened at over 80 film festivals worldwide, garnering such awards as Best LGBT Short Film, Best International Short, Best Director, Best Editing, Best Ensemble Cast, Alternative Spirit Award, Best Actor and Audience Choice Award.

Song Lang is Leon's first feature film. It is an elaboration of his interrupted upbringing in Vietnam and a nostalgic tribute to his beloved Cai-luong. Coincidentally, the film was completed and premiered in 2018, on the 100 year anniversary of this wonderfully unique theatrical art form.

Leon is currently splitting his time between NewYork City and Vietnam.

THE CAST



LIEN BINH PHAT (Dung) is the break out Vietnamese star of 2018. With no prior acting experience, he won the leading role of Dung after four months of auditions. For his feature role debut, he recieved the Gemestone Award at the Tokyo International Film Festival for Rising Star, Best Actor in A Feature at the Face of the Year Award in Vietnam, and Best Actor from the Vietnam Cinema Association Award. After the critical success of Song Lang, he is now one of the most sought after leading man in Vietnam.



ISAAC (Linh Phung) born Pham Luu Tuan Tai, Isaac currently is one of Vietnam's most popular popstars. After an unsuccessful try out for Vietnam Idol in 2007, he was chosen to be the lead singer in 565, a boyband comprises of five male members from 2010 until 2016 when he decided to pursue a solo career. He received the Rising Star Award from the Asia Star Awards at the Busan International Film Festival for his role as the Crown Prince in Tam Cam, the Untold Story. In 2018 he was named one of Forbes Vietnam Under 50 Summit.
