Tagline

Like mother, like daughter.

Logline

Connected through a shared love of Bollywood, a distant mother and daughter come of age in two different eras.

Short synopsis

Azra is worlds apart from her conservative Muslim mother. When her father suddenly dies on a trip home to Pakistan, Azra finds herself on a Bollywood-inspired journey through memories, both real and imagined; from her mother's youth in Karachi to her own coming- of-age in rural Canada.

Long synopsis

It's 1999. 22-year-old queer Pakistani grad student AZRA (Amrit Kaur) lives in Toronto with her girlfriend and has a strained relationship with her conservative mother, MARIAM (Nimra Bucha). Mariam and her husband HASSAN (Hamza Haq) are traveling to Pakistan to visit family, and on the trip, Hassan has a sudden heart attack and dies.

Azra immediately flies to Karachi for the burial. She is impacted by the sounds and smells of a city that are so distant and yet so familiar, her land, her mother's land. This flashes her back to her mother's youth – 1969 Karachi, in its 'Golden Age.' Here, a 22-year-old YOUNG MARIAM (also played by Kaur) is in conflict with her own mother, AMIRA, who insists Mariam must marry a man who will stay and live in Pakistan. Despite this, Mariam and Hassan's Bollywood love story unfolds. When it's revealed Hassan has accepted a job in Canada, Mariam's mother is furious, but it's too late to stop their plan to leave.

As Azra struggles with the loss of her father in 1999, denied the right to participate in burial rituals or even accompany the funeral procession to the cemetery - she's flashed back to her own childhood in 1989 Nova Scotia, Canada. There, Azra and Mariam struggle to fit into a mostly white, Christian town. Hassan has his first heart attack. Terrified of losing him, Mariam promises Allah she'll "submit" if he lives. After Hassan recovers, at Azra's 13th birthday party, Mariam catches Azra kissing another girl; horrified, she turns to religion for answers.

In 1999 Karachi, Amira, Mariam's mother, now has dementia, and confuses Azra for "Mariam." Azra explores Karachi, finds a bootlegger and drowns her sorrows on the beach. The next morning, she bathes her grandmother. Still seeing Azra as her own daughter Mariam, Amira apologizes for their decades-old feud. Azra's empathy for her mother deepens, realizing that Mariam will never get this apology from her mother directly. When Mariam and Azra finally visit Hassan's grave together, a new potential for connection emerges.

Director's Statement - by Fawzia Mirza

The Queen of My Dreams is a dramedy spanning 30 years in the life of a Pakistani-Canadian family. It's an exploration of the intergenerational connections between mothers and daughters, East and West, home and away, infused with humor, romance, music and Bollywood fantasy. Inspired by personal experiences, some of my mother's stories, intertwined with Pakistani history and collective memory. The film shows the expansive journey of women, seeking to define and decide their own paths, while simultaneously learning – and remembering – how to love. And it explores the question I find myself asking in all my work, "How do we become who we are?"

To answer that question, I turned to my conservative mother, a woman who seems so different from me, and yet, we are so similar. She's told me some stories of her past, which made her sound like a movie star, like the iconic actress Sharmila Tagore. But the past still felt like a mystery. I wanted to know more. I found myself nostalgic for her youth in 1960s Pakistan, 'The Golden Era' of the country. That was a place I'd never been, but I found myself yearning to visit. It didn't sound anything like the Pakistan I knew. And I just wanted to understand my mother better. It's why the 60s was such an important era in this film. Who I am is impacted by who my mother is, but also who she <u>was</u>. And who <u>her</u> mother was – our intergenerational connection. Inspired by this, and the South Asian cinematic device of "doubling," I made the creative choice to cast the same actor who plays Azra at 22 to play her mother at the same age in 1969.

Music evokes memory and nostalgia and the music throughout the film is intended to do just that. In fact, the film's title is inspired by the 1969 Sharmila Tagore hit film, "Aradhana" and one of its classic songs, *Mere Sapnon Ki Rani* (The Queen of My Dreams). It's a song about a man finding the love of his life, the queen of his dreams. I grew up in a heteronormative patriarchal society, so I always fantasized some man would sing this to me. When I came out as queer, I thought the song no longer applied, or rather, maybe a woman would sing it to me. But I realized I am the queen of my own dreams. And in Azra's journey in the film, she realizes she has the agency to step out of the generational mistakes made by her mother and her mother before her. Azra is the queen of her own dreams.

This film is my way of traveling to the past, to imagine a world my mother might have lived in. A world that blends genres — rich, technicolor, heightened scenes inspired by *Mere Sapnon Ki Rani* amidst the realities of grief and loss. This film folds those ideas into the storytelling through flashback, comedy, fantasy sequences, *qawaali-inspired* music set in the places that I've romanticized through memory: 1969 Karachi, Pakistan and 1989, Sydney, Nova Scotia, Canada.

Much like our lives, making this film has been a journey. It began in 2012 as a short film (also titled) THE QUEEN OF MY DREAMS and then a play ME, MY MOM & SHARMILA in 2014, after which I worked on the screenplay for seven years, in various iterations and collaborations, before entering pre-production, Summer 2022.

Fawzia Mirza (she/they) is a White House Champion of Change in Asian storytelling, an alum of the Tribeca Film Institute, TIFF Writer's Studio and Filmmaker Lab, Ryan Murphy's Half Initiative, and the Canadian Academy of Women Directors' Program, and her new feature script HEIRLOOM was named to the 2022 Muslim List - The Black List's curation of the best unproduced scripts by Muslim writers. Her feature directorial debut THE QUEEN OF MY DREAMS, shot in Canada and Pakistan, world premiered at TIFF 2023, had its international premiere at the BFI London Film Festival and was nominated for the Director's Guild of Canada's Jean-Marc Vallée Discovery Award and the BFI's Sutherland First Feature Award. She co-wrote, produced & starred in the feature SIGNATURE MOVE which world premiered at SXSW and won 15 awards around the globe (including the US Grand Jury Prize Outfest). She wrote on Ava DuVernay and Greg Berlanti's CBS series THE RED LINE; her episode marked the first queer, Muslim romance on network TV. She wrote/directed the short films I KNOW HER (Palm Springs, Outfest, CBC Short Film Face Off Finalist) NOOR & LAYLA (BlackStar, Bentonville, Short of the Week, distributed by Frameline Voices, CBC GEM & Argo) BROWN ELEPHANT (20th Digital Studio, 2.3M views), and on TikTok series HIDDEN CANYONS. She directed THE SYED FAMILY XMAS EVE GAME NIGHT (written by and starring Kausar Mohammed) which world premiered at TIFF 2021, was named to Canada's Top 10 and one of Harper's Bazaar's "Best Christmas Movies of 2021". Her short AUNTIE, executive produced by Paul Feig, is now streaming on The New Yorker. She co-founded and runs BABY DAAL PRODUCTIONS with her wife, producer Andria Wilson Mirza.

Hamza Haq - Hassan Malik



Named one of Canada's Rising Stars by The Hollywood Reporter in 2017, Hamza Haq stars as Bashir 'Bash' Hamed in the groundbreaking CTV/NBC medical drama *Transplant* for which won a Canadian Screen Award for Best Lead Actor in a Drama Series in 2021, 2022 and 2023.

Prior to *Transplant*, Hamza played twins Amal and Gopal opposite William Shatner and Russell Peters in the CTV mini-series *Indian Detective*, and was recognized with a Canadian Screen Award nomination for his role of Raza Ali in the CBC series *This Life* in 2018. Early in his professional career, he hosted two seasons of the International Emmy Award nominated children's series *Look Kool*. Additional television credits include *Quantico*, *Designated Survivor*, *The Bold Type*, *Being Human* and *Best Laid Plans*. He will also appear in the upcoming family dramedy *Ruining Eid* (working title) for Netflix MENA.

On the big screen, Hamza currently stars in the Canadian independent feature *With Love and a Major Organ* and the soon to be released *The Queen of my Dreams* with Amrit Kaur. He has also appeared with Margaret Qualley in *My Salinger Year*, which opened the 70th Berlin International Film Festival in February 2020, and more recently had a supporting role in the French Canadian feature *Viking*. Additional credits include *Bon Cop*, *Bad Cop 2* with Colm Feore, *The Death and Life of John F. Donovan* directed by Xavier Dolan and Darren Aronofsky's *Mother*!

Hamza is a 2020 recipient of RBC's top 25 Canadian Immigrants Award and recently partnered with the Canada Media Fund's Made | Nous campaign as ambassador to celebrate Islamic History Month. He spoke at the 2021 TEDxTORONTO Fall digital event series 'Uncharted' using his public platform to speak on issues important to him, including refugees' rights, racial injustice, and combating stereotypes; and was honoured as Playback's Breakout Star of the Year. Raised in Ottawa, Hamza is youngest of four siblings born in Saudi Arabia to Pakistani parents and has called Canada home since the age of nine. He holds a Bachelor of Arts in Film Studies with a minor in Law from Carleton University.

Andria Wilson Mirza - Producer

Andria is a CMPA IndieScreen Award-Nominated producer and the co-founder of Baby Daal Productions, which she runs with her wife, filmmaker Fawzia Mirza. She produced Fawzia's feature film debut THE QUEEN OF MY DREAMS, a Pakistan-Canada co-production that world premiered at TIFF 2023. Baby Daal's feature slate also includes Sandra Itäinen's queer Muslim documentary COMING AROUND, and Drew Denny's GIFTED, which centers survivors of intimate partner violence with an all-survivor crew and creative team. Andria executive produced Lulu Wei's feature documentary SUPPORTING OUR SELVES for OUTtv, which was awarded the jury prize for Best Canadian Feature at IOFF23. Andria also serves as the Director of ReFrame, Hollywood's gender equity coalition founded by Sundance Institute and Women In Film (WIF), and is on the advisory board of Hire Survivors Hollywood and the management committee of Anita Hill's Hollywood <u>Commission</u>. Previously, she was Executive Director of Inside Out, Canada's largest LGBTQ film festival. There, she established the world's only LGBTQ Feature Film Financing Forum, launched two development funds, co-founded the North American Queer Festival Alliance (NAQFA), and spearheaded a multi-year partnership between Inside Out and Netflix. Named 'one of 15 Canadian women to watch' by the CBC, Andria has been a featured speaker at festivals including TIFF, Sundance, Cannes Marche du Film, SXSW, AFM, EFM, Comic Con, and the Iris Prize Producer's Forum.
